Today, The Queen's Medical Center (QMC) is licensed to operate 505 acute care beds and 28 sub-acute beds. With nearly 4,000 employees and 1,060 physicians on staff, it is the state's largest private nonprofit hospital that services more than 264,000 outpatient visits, 25,000-plus admissions and over 56,000 emergency room visits a year.

As the leading medical referral center in Hawaii and the Pacific Basin, QMC offers a comprehensive range of primary care and specialized services. Its oncology, orthopedics, cardiology, neuroscience, genetics, obstetrics, critical care and emergency departments are leaders in their fields.

The medical center is part of The Queen's Health Systems, which is dedicated to serving everyone and continues to contribute to the well-being of Hawaii by giving back to our community. Queen's provides millions of dollars in health care services, education, charitable contributions, and uncompensated care as part of its mission.

Our Proud Heritage

Established in 1859 by Queen Emma and King Kamehameha IV to address the healthcare needs of the people of Hawaii during a time when epidemics were sweeping the Islands, The Queen's Medical Center is the first hospital in the United States founded by royalty. Queen Emma and King Kamehameha IV went door-to-door to personally raise money to build the hospital, which was named The Queen's Hospital. Through this effort, the King and Queen were able to open a temporary structure in 1859, and a year later, opened a two-story 124-bed facility, which was built on the present site.
